## CEO of the Corporation for National and Community Service to Lead Connecticut AmeriCorps Ceremony Thursday

Hartford, Nov. 5 — Wendy Spencer, chief executive officer of the Corporation for National and Community Service, will be in Connecticut Thursday (Nov. 7) to swear in 350 new AmeriCorps members at the <u>Trumbull Marriott</u>. This year celebrates the <u>20th anniversary</u> of the establishment of the Corporation which administers all federal service programs. <u>Spencer</u> has led the agency since April 2012.

The new AmeriCorps inductees will be sworn in at **noon in Salon ABCD** by Spencer following her keynote address. Joining her will be William R. Dyson, chair of the <u>Connecticut Commission on Community Service</u>, and Jane A. Ciarleglio, executive director of the <u>Office of Higher Education</u> where the Commission is located. The individuals being sworn in include college students, teachers, mentors and older adults for whom the ceremony marks the start of a year of intensive community service for which they may receive an education award of up to \$5,645 that they or their family members may use, as well as benefits including health insurance and child day-care.

The latest members join 600 other AmeriCorps members already serving throughout the state. The new AmeriCorps members will serve in nine programs recently selected to receive 2013 AmeriCorps Grants:

- <u>Bridgeport</u>: **MYO AmeriCorps**, Regional Youth/Adult Social Action Partnership (\$308,374) AmeriCorps members assist in preventing dating abuse in Bridgeport Public Schools.
- <u>Bridgeport, Hartford, Waterbury and Willimantic</u>: **CT AHEC Network AmeriCorps Program**, Northwestern Connecticut AHEC (\$234,000) AmeriCorps members work with high school and college students in serving community health needs.
- Bridgeport, East Hartford, Hartford, Naugatuck Valley, New Britain, New Haven, New London, Norwich, Rockville, Waterbury and Windham: FoodCorps Connecticut, FoodCorps, Inc., (\$142,500) AmeriCorps members deliver food and nutrition education to needy K-12 students.
- <u>Bridgeport, Hartford, New Haven</u>: **Public Allies Connecticut**, Public Allies, Inc. (\$494,000) AmeriCorps members focus on capacity building to strengthen the ability of nonprofits to solve community issues.
- <u>Bridgeport, Hartford, New Haven, Stamford and Windham</u>: **Teach for America Connecticut**, Teach for America (\$168,800) AmeriCorps members teach in urban public schools.
- <u>Danbury</u>: **AmeriCorps Collegiate Development Program**, Hispanic Center of Danbury, Inc. (\$79,714) AmeriCorps members provide college mentoring to high school students in Danbury- area high schools.
- <u>Hamden and New Haven</u>: **Experience Corps**, Agency on Aging of South Central Connecticut, Inc. (\$160,398) AmeriCorps members aged 55 and older tutor elementary school children.
- <u>Hartford</u>: **Green Crew**, Knox Parks Foundation (\$118,624) AmeriCorps members provide green jobs training and counseling to out-of-school youth.
- <u>Waterbury</u>: **Waterbury AmeriCorps**, Naugatuck Valley Community College (\$158,266)- AmeriCorps members tutor and mentor middle school students.
